## Main course components:

International peer-review journals. The text on specialty as an subject of scientific knowledge. Types of the scientific text. The paragraph as an architectonic unit of the scientific text. Classification, content, structure and design of the research paper. Presenting and socializing at a conference.

*Forms and teaching methods:* practical tasks, workshop discussions, presentations.
