Assessment system of learning outcomes

The final grade in the discipline is calculated taking into account the points obtained for the final tests, and the points obtained during the current control of the accumulative system. The total result in points for the semester is: "60 or more points - credited" (maximum number of points - 100), "59 or less points - not credited" and is entered in the test "Statement of success" of the discipline. In case of receiving less than 60 points, the student must pass the test after the end of the examination session within the period set by the dean of the faculty, but not later than two weeks after the beginning of the semester. More detailed information on assessment is given in the technological map of the discipline.

Discipline policies

Academic Integrity Policy: All written works are checked for plagiarism and are allowed to be defended with correct text borrowings of no more than 20%. Write-offs during control works are forbidden (including with use of mobile devices). Class Skip Policy: Class attendance is a mandatory component of the assessment for which points are awarded. For objective reasons (illness, international internship) training can take place online with the consent of the dean's office. Policy for the performance of tasks later than the deadline: works that are submitted in violation of deadlines without good reason, are evaluated at a lower score (-20%).
