Assessment system

The University uses a 100-point cumulative system for assessing the learning outcomes of students. Current control is carried out during lectures, practical and seminar classes and is aimed at checking the level of readiness of the student to perform a specific job and is evaluated by the amount of points scored: – for courses with a form of semester control as grading: maximum amount is 100 points; minimum amount required is 60 points. The final control includes current control and assessment of the student.
