Assessment system

Assessment of students' learning outcomes is carried out by the University according to the cumulative 100-point system.

The final grade for the training course is determined by summing the points for the current and final control. During the training course, the following control measures are used: Current control: competence-oriented practical tasks (30 points), written control work (20 points), current laboratory works by topics (24 points), report in the form of essay (26 points). The maximum score based on the results of the comprehensive training is 100 points, the minimum passing score is 60.
